The purpose of this correspondence is to provide you an update regarding e-Learning through the end of the school year. Please see the important information bulleted below

- **Dual Credit Courses**: Students taking Dual Credit courses will continue to follow the guidance of our junior college partners.
- **AP Courses**: Students taking AP courses, will continue to prepare for the AP examinations.
- Lessons: For all other courses, no new lessons will be generated in PowerSchool Unified Classroom after April 30.
- **May's Emphasis**: e-Learning in the month of May will consist encouraging mastery learning for students having completed their work. That is, redoing and improving their assignments. For students who have fallen behind, May's e-Learning will be a chance to get caught up.
- **Course Completion**: When students have satisfied their e-Learning in each subject, they will be marked as having completed the course.
- **Extra Help:** During May, teachers will continue with office hours as scheduled, but will use Zoom for individual assistance as needed. These extra help sessions can be individual student or small group. This will be critical in helping students who have fallen behind.
- Seniors: The last day for seniors who have completed all their e-Learning satisfactorily will be Tuesday, May 12. On Friday, May 15, seniors will return to Seneca High School in order to clean out their hall and PE lockers, gather personal belongings and return all school property, such as books, laptops and laptop cases, and uniforms.
- Other Classes: The last day of e-Learning for freshman, sophomores, and juniors will be Friday, May 15. Turn-in day for Juniors is Tuesday, May 19, for Sophomores is Wednesday, May 20, and for Freshman is Friday, May 22.

GRADING and EARNING COURSE CREDIT

While the disruption to traditional schooling has been a challenge, <u>e-Learning is mandatory</u>. Lessons during e-Learning must be completed. Students not completing e-Learning will receive an Incomplete (I). Incompletes must be made up over the summer before a senior student can receive a diploma.

For returning students: If a student does not remove the incomplete before school resumes for the 2020-21 school year, missing assignments will be recorded as zeros and grades calculated. Incompletes will then be converted to letter grades, including the potential for students to earn failing grades or reduced grades.
